Assets

Stocks: The current stocks value includes largely of sellable publications.

Notes to the profit and loss statement

Turnover: the turnover increased slightly to € 13,477 in 2019 and consists of sales of Agrodoks (€ 4.978) and donations (€ 9,135).

Direct costs: involved the costs for printing Agrodoks.

Housing costs were booked as \in 0, we have not received an invoice for 2019 for which we thank Wageningen University and Research.

In 2019 we managed to operate without personnel (volunteer) costs.

General costs: include cost for office up-keeping, administration and bookkeeping services, the website, general insurance etc.

Sales costs: include costs for sending orders and packaging materials etc.

The result over 2019 was a positive € 9,977 mainly as a result of generous donations made by private donors and a trust fund. For the cost reduction in housing expenses we are thankful to Wageningen University and Research who did not charge us. Many of the budgeted activities could be realised at low cost because as concerned labour was provided voluntary (Lecture series, lesson material development, guidance of project groups, website support services and last but not least the sale of Agrodok publications, including packaging and sending etc).

All of this could be realised with the support of our valued volunteers, partners and supporters. For those whom it concerns a big thank you.
